Next come the jobs – there is only one here – a breakdown job with a description of the problem

Some space for you to make notes which Mantra can keep in the job history

The jobsheet shows 'kit' needed to do these jobs – and advises that a permit is needed to work on this item

These are both planned jobs that are due – the first one every 4 weeks with 4 tasks, and the second has 2 tasks every year – you can set up a plan of work like this for each item and Mantra automatically does the paperwork for you

Mantra automatically allocates unique job numbers

**This jobsheet is an example of planned jobs for John Smith -
the previous example is a breakdown job for a Grade 1 Plumber -
if all these jobs occur at the same time
and are all allocated to John Smith,
Mantra puts them on the same jobsheet to make sure
they are done with only one trip to the item**

The next example uses a built-in Mantra feature called a masterlist - if you wish, you can use it to show the supervisor what jobs are being done now

The masterlist is a special form of report - its layout is controlled by report generator instructions in the same way as report and jobsheet layouts are controlled

Previous examples showed jobsheet layouts with quite a lot of detail - some users may want an abbreviated jobsheet as shown below - this jobsheet was created by using a different jobsheet layout file

Mantra has calculated the scheduled interval in days and times per year – you can export the data to a spreadsheet for analysis
